Paul Thompson, NH native and UNH alum is a legendary figure in the NH hockey world and one who deserves to be recognized for his contributions both on and off the ice. When players were departing for junior teams and other prep schools in New England, Paul stayed true to his roots, playing for two seasons at Pinkerton, establishing himself as a standout player who many began to watch. He then took his talents to the junior level, playing dynamically for the Jr. Monarchs, becoming both the EJHL player of the year and an All-Star. Following his junior career, Paul once again decided to stay "home" when it came time to consider his options and played for 4 years at UNH. His most successful year being when he was a senior, where he was a Hobey Baker Finalist. Paul left his mark at UNH, becoming the highest scoring New Hampshire native on the UNH ice hockey team in the past thirty years.

His efforts, skills and passion for the game quickly allowed pro teams to take notice and following his collegiate career, Paul signed with the Penguins. Paul had an illustrious pro career that spanned over 13 years. We can discuss the goals, the points, even the fights. But along the way Paul was also the ultimate teammate. He did things the right way, put his head down and worked. The selflessness, work ethic, respect and loyalty instilled in him from his parents, allowed for him to embark upon a career playing the game he learned as a child in Derry. Hockey in New Hampshire has been imbedded in Paul's life throughout its entirety; from the pond skates in his backyard to youth hockey with the Manchester Flames, from Pinkerton to the Monarchs to UNH, playing hockey in his home state was a part of him and forever will be.

Though he now coaches at Loomis Chaffee and resides in CT, Paul still returns "home" frequently, bringing his skates, of course, to play hockey on the lakes with his children, showing them a slice of what NH hockey truly means to him.
